

INTERURBAN STATION

The passenger station and waiting room of the interurban street railways will be ready for use within the next 30 days. It will be at the northwest corner of Gay and Wall streets, where the old Deming and Urlin stone property now stands. Plans prepared by Messrs. Richards, McCarty & Bulford call for an extensive remodeling of the house. The alterations will be mostly in porches and platforms and of course the removal of the fences and other time-worn accessories of the present building. Work in making the much-needed changes will begin the first of this week at the latest. The Columbus London & Springfield railway people have leased the building.
