BROKEN WHEEL IS CAUSE OF WRECK

C., A. & C. Freight Train Is Stacked Up at Galena in the Early Morning.

BIG PROPERTY LOSS.

Passenger Trains Are Delayed – The Wreck Crew Works on Blockade.

(Columbus Dispatch, October 28, 1905) A serious freight wreck at Galena, 19 miles north of Columbus, on the C., A. & C. railroad, was caused, early Saturday morning, by a broken wheel. The train was running at good speed, and cars were piled high in the air, on top of each other, and badly damaged. The property loss will be heavy, as the cars were loaded, but no one was injured.

Passenger train No. 506, due in Columbus at 1:50 a.m., did not arrived until 5:06.

A Pan Handle wreck crew was sent to the accident, and cleaned up the smashedup cars.
