

WRECK TIES UP ROAD.

Dozen Loaded Coal Cars Pile Up On
C., A. & C. Near Minerva Park –
Due to “Weaving.”

(Columbus Evening Dispatch, July 3, 1917) Traffic on the C. A. & C. railroad was tied up Tuesday night, while about a hundred work men cleared away the wreckage which resulted when 12 loaded coal cars piled up near Minerva park. The wreck is believed to have been due to “weaving” of the cars while rounding a curve. Coal and cars were piled up 20 feet high. No one was injured.
