

Near Train Wreck At Flint.

Traffic Delayed for Two Hours

What might have been a very serious accident occurred at 11 o'clock Friday morning, when the engine on the Twentieth century Limited was wrecked at the subway across the County Line road, north of Flint.

The drive wheel broke and rolled down the embankment and the side of the engine caved in. The wreck train from Columbus was ordered out, removed the debris, and pulled the train in. Traffic was tied up for two hours, but no one was injured. The train crew declared it almost a miracle that none of the coaches left the track, in which event many lives would have been lost.
