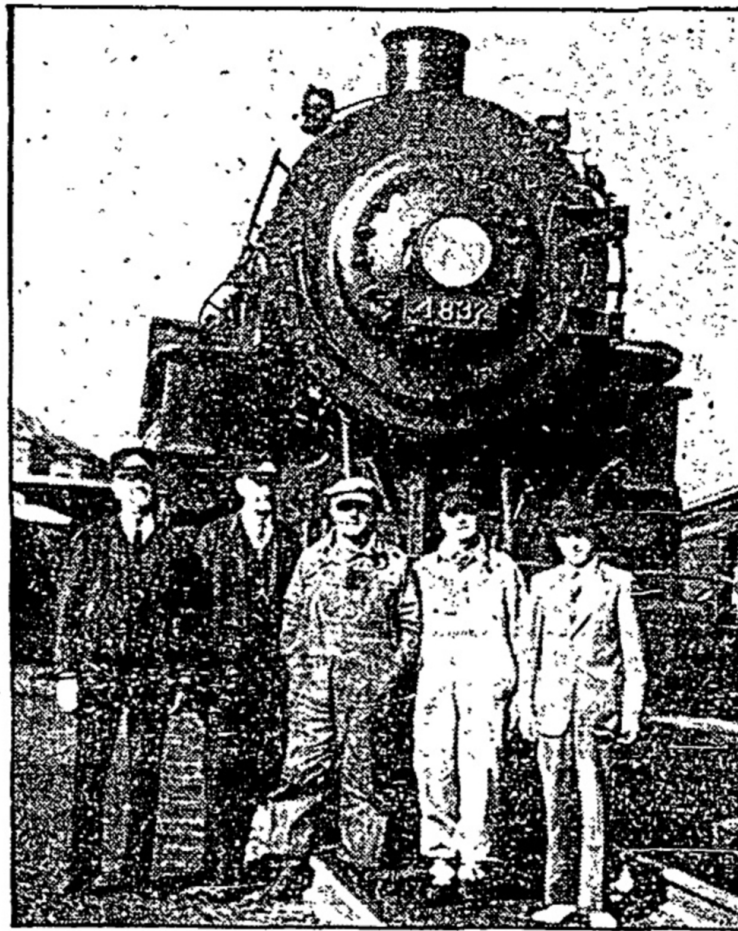


Camera Train to Run Monday



(Columbus Dispatch, May 27, 1938) Camera and railroad fans are busily engaged making plans for their big picnic outing Monday, [May 30], when they will travel to Hobson, Ohio, on Columbus' first camera train.

Sponsored by the Railroad Camera club and the Railroad and Model Guild of Central Ohio, the trip will cover railroad and scenic points of interest in the Sunday Creek and Ohio river valleys.
